

## **How To Handle Emergency Garage Door Situations**

If you're locked out of the garage, check if the remote batteries are okay. Most opener systems have backups like keypads and gate buttons. If this doesn't work, or the garage door opens manually, then something might be wrong with the parts.

If your garage door won't open and you need to get to a place, the problem can wait until later. Call up your garage door technician for an appointment, then commute or carpool to your destination. If you have an automatic opener system and you think it might get busted, remember to disconnect it before leaving. The last thing you want is to see your garage door finally open when you're not around.

Whatever you do, don't try to break in or destroy the garage door in order to gain access. Not only will this seem suspicious to your neighbors, it will cost you a lot as well. An emergency situation means something is wrong with the garage door or its parts, and you do not want to double possible repair costs by trying to break it. Also, if you try to break the garage door, fail and then decide to call a technician at the end, the door is vulnerable to security breaches until then.

## Prevention is the key

Lockouts are more complicated, especially if it's in the middle of the night and you live alone. There are technicians like us who perform emergency work, and it's always good to have their
